Team Richmond regains podium position

On Sunday 6 July Team Richmond celebrated the end of a very successful 2014 London Youth Games with a finish in third place overall out of 33 London boroughs.



London Youth Games involve the 33 London boroughs competing against each other in over 30 different sports. Over 450 young people who live or go to school in the borough competed for Team Richmond this year.

From the first event which began with Cross Country in November 2013 to the Games closing ceremony on Sunday 6 July Team Richmond picked up 5 team gold, 3 team silver and 6 team bronze medals as well as 110 individual medals. Team Richmond were also crowned Regatta Champions which combines the results from Canoe Slalom, Canoe Sprint, Rowing and Sailing teams. The mini Games which are open to those in primary school also did themselves proud. The boccia team, who came 13th overall, didn't have to travel far as the event was held at St Mary's University and it was great to have an event so near. The mini swimmers finished in 6th place overall and our two paragames swimmers both won individual medals. Team Richmond's mini footballers picked up some silverware finishing in third place overall.

2014 was a magnificent year for the talented athletes of our borough and Team Richmond look forward to another successful year in 2015 which starts with Cross Country in November 2014.
