## Team Richmond celebrate a magical year

#### Team Richmond has become the Balfour **Beatty London Youth Games Champions for** the first time in the events 34 year history.

Over 400 young people living or attending school in the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames took part in the Games. The Games began back in November with the Cross Country and came to a climax at Crystal Palace National Sports Centre at the beginning of July. The Games involves all 32 London boroughs and the City of London, competing against each other in over 50 sporting events.

Team Richmond achieved 28 top ten results, with six team gold's (cross country, rowing, kayak sprint, cycling, aquathlon and archery), three team silvers (girls tag rugby, girl's athletics and boys squash) and three team bronze



(girl's volleyball, indoor rowing and adaptive indoor rowing). Team Richmond's landmark year also saw them collect the Thames Water London Youth Games Regatta Trophy as overall water sport champions for the third year in a row.

Team Richmond also excelled in the Mini Games on Thursday 30 June, where over 80 talented youngsters from primary schools across the borough competed in eight sports. The highlight of the day came when the netball team took first place to become netball champions 2011 for the second year in a row. We also had fantastic second place results for the football, hockey and tag rugby teams.

Overall it has been an incredible year for Team Richmond and we hope to retain our London Youth Games Champions title for the Olympic year in 2012. Congratulations to all who represented the borough.
