# The 'Halloween Code'

**We want you to stay safe when trick or treating by following the 'Halloween Code':**

- 1** Always go trick or treating with an adult
- 2** Only go to houses where you or your friends know the residents
- 3** Don't knock on doors where there is a 'No Trick or Treat' sign
- 4** Stay in areas that are well lit with street lights - take a torch with you just in case
- 5** Stay with your friends - don't split into smaller groups unless an adult goes with you
- 6** Don't talk to strangers on the street
- 7** Don't enter any house - stay on the doorstep
- 8** Be careful not to frighten vulnerable people, especially the elderly
- 9** Be visible
- 10** Look carefully before crossing the road, even if you're part of a group
- 11** Don't vandalise anything or throw things like eggs and flour. This can cause a great deal of damage and misery. What's more it can be classed as criminal damage, or even assault, and a night of 'fun' could end up with you in trouble with the police

- 12** Better still, why not just stay at home and have a Halloween themed party with your friends and neighbours!
