## 2. Find out more about housing & homelessness in the borough

Attached is the latest issue of the JSNA Newsletter - a rolling publication produced by the Council's Public Health team that describes the health, social care and wellbeing of local residents. This issue provides information about housing and homelessness, including the services the Council provides. It highlights how good quality housing can promote independence and improve wellbeing and the risks of poor housing to health. Focusing on the inter-connectivity of housing and health fits in with the Council's commitment to address the 'wider determinants of public health'. This newsletter focuses on one of the key housing issues facing London boroughs today, homelessness, when a landlord ends a tenancy in the private rented sector. It also looks at the impact that inadequately heated homes can have on health, investigates how specialist extra care supported housing provision can enable older people to maintain independent living and finally review the benefits that 'supported housing' can have for a range of Richmond residents. Since the Alliance was set up by Richmond Council in 2014, membership has snowballed to 69 groups and organisations. The Council is working to roll out a similar approach in Hampton Hill by linking in with the Village Planning process that is currently taking place.
