

CYPP consultation summary – “You said”

In preparing for the Children and Young People's plan we have reviewed what children and young people have told us about their priorities for Richmond between 2019 and 2022. The ages range from 7 years old to 25 years old. Participants were identified from primary, secondary, special schools, colleges, home education, adult education facilities, and those participating in programmes and doing voluntary work.

We collected information from the following consultations with children and young people:

- Achieving for Children Family Engagement Survey (2022) 267 respondents. 163 from Richmond and 104 from Kingston. Majority (54%) had two children. The ages of the children in the households responding to the survey were between 0 – 12+ years old.
- Health Related Behaviour Survey (2022) 4883 pupils took part from 18 primary and junior schools and 7 secondary schools. Ages 8 to 15 years old.
- Mi Voice Youth Council Elections (2022) 5,000 young people voted in the Kingston and Richmond Youth Council and UK Youth Parliament Elections.
- Make Your Mark (2022) (Kingston and Richmond Youth Council) 5,000 young people in Kingston and Richmond
- Children in Care Council Children's and Young People's Survey (2022) 23 participants
- Young People's Views about Preparing for Adulthood and Transition for Richmond's Written Statement of Action (October 2021) 35 young people aged 13-24 years old.
- Kingston and Richmond Youth Council Sexual Harassment in Schools Survey (2020) 817 young women aged 11-18 years old.
- Richmond Youth Wellbeing Survey (August 2020) 410 respondents aged 11-19+.
- Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Youth People's Voices and Health Group (2020) Richmond and Kingston
- Richmond Youth Needs Analysis (2020) 248 respondents aged 10 – 25 years old.
- Richmond Climate Change Strategy and Air Quality Action Plan Survey for Young People (October 2019). 182 respondents aged 11-18 years old (mostly 11-12 years old)
- Richmond SEND Futures Plan Consultation (July 2019) 38 children and young people aged 7 – 23 years old.
