Commentary:

The level of CIL receipts have increased significantly from over the first three years of operation of the Borough's CIL reflecting the fact that CIL is only payable when a development commences. In 2014/15 £33,250 Borough CIL was collected, by 2016/17, the third year of operation, the annual CIL receipts amounted to £6,874,577, with nearly £7.3m being collected in total since the introduction of the Borough's CIL.

Reflecting the fact that CIL can only be spent directly on infrastructure once it has been collected and cannot be used to pay off loans, the Council has yet to spend any CIL. However, progress has been made on the allocation of CIL both at the strategic and neighbourhood level and expenditure is expected to be made in 2017/18.

In Richmond neighbourhood CIL is also known as the Village Planning Fund. The Council agreed neighbourhood boundaries, representing groups of wards, and the process for the allocation of neighbourhood CIL, in March 2017. As a Neighbourhood Plan is currently being developed for the Ham and Petersham village this has been identified as a separate area.

The process for the allocation of NCIL will have been trialled and evaluated by the end of the calendar year. It is anticipated that the majority of NCIL funds available will be allocated to schemes of community benefit within this timeframe.
