**Cllr Gareth Roberts:** Good Evening. We have just watched the Prime Ministers broadcast from 10 Downing Street in which we were hoping to get more clarity regarding the closure of schools tomorrow. Yesterday the Prime Minister announced that schools would close from close of business on Friday (tomorrow), apart from for vulnerable children and children whose parents work in key industries. Unfortunately, we are still lacking the clarity as to what counts as a key worker. This is vital. It is vital information that schools need so that they can plan properly so they can open for those children on Monday. As soon as we get that information, we will give it to you through our website and via our social media feeds.

As a Council we recognise that we also need to be doing more in order to help during this Covid-19 Coronavirus pandemic. And for that reason, we are taking the difficult reason to ask those workers in the Council who can work from home to work from home. By doing this we can make sure we cut down on journeys on our road network and on our public transport system. However, this does mean that we will have fewer staff on site, in the Civic Centre. And certainly, don't come to the Civic Centre if you have any symptoms of Coronavirus Covid19 or you are self-isolating. If you do need to phone, then the phone lines will stay open however, if I can stress, please only call if it is an urgent matter.
