We are pleased to present this year's CiCC action plan for April 2021 - March 2022. As always, the action plan has been developed by the Children in Care Council.

Our objectives include the following.

- The CiCC to be supported to deliver events, build communities, strengthen networks and increase engagement.
- The CiCC to support the physical health and emotional wellbeing of care leavers.
- The CiCC to receive training on dealing with child sexual and criminal exploitation.
- The CiCC to be supported to develop training for new staff.
- The CiCC to be supported to develop workshops for children and looked after children.
- Children and young people to be involved at every level in the development of the services received by children and young people.

Dania, one of our care leavers from the Children in Care Council, teamed up with Crafty Little Bakers in March, which saw children in foster placements bake mooncakes live and online with Dania.

All the materials and dry ingredients for this fun baking session were posted out to our bakers in preparation. It was a great way to learn some independent kitchen skills during lockdown while giving young children a chance to socialise with the CiCC.



#### **PRISON PACKS**

A small number of our care leavers are in prison and this is a very difficult time for them.

Recently, our participation officer, Chris, and leaving care team manager, Jenny, met with two such care leavers and talked about the physical necessities they'd like more of.

Top of the charts were towels, socks, underwear, sheets and duvets. So we have created a prison pack brimming full of these essentials.

#### **UPDATES ON CHAMPIONS**

Some of our champions representing all our main areas caught up with some heads of service. Below you can read about those meetings, updates, and our actions.

#### **LEAVING CARE CHAMPION**

It's Tash here, the Leaving Care Champion. At the end of January, myself and participation officer, Chris McPhee, met up with Shaira Makorie, Head of Leaving Care. We talked about how we can improve the support received by young people within the service who are in prison. This included sending packs to any young person who goes to prison which includes a tracksuit, sheets and other essentials.

Shaira is also working with Kingston and Richmond housing to ensure young people have accommodation when they leave prison. Alongside this, the CiCC are going to create a new champion within the youth justice and adolescent safeguarding teams to grow our presentation across all areas of AfC. Also, we agreed to work on updating the care leaver financial policy for care leavers and to work together when updating it.

The Leaving Care Team have been awarded a Covid winter grant which has been used to ensure any care leaver in need has received food vouchers and heating payments.

Finally, there is going to be a new team leader position opening within the Leaving Care Team and the CiCC will be involved in the interviewing.

#### **FOSTERING CHAMPION**

Fostering champion, Bel, and participation officer, Chris, met with Natalie Bugeja from the Fostering Team. Ideas from our meeting included a more active role in recruiting new foster carers, increased offer to support skills to foster training, and a task force to ensure supervising social workers are capturing the voice of children in foster placements.

#### **LEAVING CARE PROJECTS**

#### 1) SUITCASE PROJECT

In February 2021, Shaira Makorie, Head of Leaving Care, worked alongside Lynn Lock, Team Leader of the Children with Disabilities Team, to get suitcases donated for all looked after children and care leavers. A local Facebook group has donated



approximately 100 suitcases and more are due to be delivered to the office. A big thank you also to Caroline Lowe, Depot Manager of SEN transport, and Jenny Burton, Team Leader of the Leaving Care Team, for arranging transportation of the suitcases.


