### **Tree Planting**

For the current planting process the Council has received grant funding for the planting of 410 new trees, which will be planted by the end of the 2022-23 planting season, this is in addition to trees that have been committed to under the legacy repair planting programme and other committed planting of replacement trees.

## **Black Poplar Plantings**

12 new black poplar trees were planted in January 2023 on the towpath in Barnes. These were planted in addition to those planted in 2021 and 2022.

## **Towpath Tree Management**

Alongside the Port of London Authority, the Council have created a wooded towpath management plan from 2022-2036. The management plan seeks to unify the approach to managing and maintaining the bank and towpath environment for the future. The plan focuses on tree and woodland management whilst considering the wider ecology, heritage and user matters.

Tree works are due to start in February 2023. The majority of the works will be carried out without any closures with diversions directing users to alternative routes.
