
## **Proposals**

It should be noted that current financial constraints on the Council mean that proposals for which it is responsible may take longer than is desirable to implement



## **Environmental Improvements**

- I The wall to the rear of 117 White Hart Lane is of bare blockwork: it is ugly and detracts from the conservation area. It should be rendered and painted or rebuilt Private ownership
- 2 The pavements require attention, with repaving in large slabs of York stone probably the most attractive option. Sett crossovers and granite kerbs to be retained wherever possible Council
- 3 The view to the north of Eleanor Grove may be improved by the planting of a tree or two to terminate the vista, while that to the south may be improved by the planting of a tree, perhaps in the garden of no. 35 White Hart Lane opposite

Council/Private ownership

- 4 The shop (Oddbins) frontage could do with some tidying up
  Private ownership
- 5 The use of colour on exterior walls is sometimes controversial. The Council considers the use of pastel or natural tints to be generally preferable to very bright colours and it is proposed that design guidance be issued to advise on the use of colour on historic façades

- 6 Street congestion is perceived to be a growing problem and the Council is committed to ensuring that parking problems in residential streets do not get any worse by continuing to review and monitor the situation Council
- 7 Concrete lamposts to be replaced by dark painted steel columns
