4.	Direct Payments and Short Breaks

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welcomed the comments and confirmed that she was open to such discussions. MW informed the group that the Direct Payments guidance is out of date and new guidance is being drafted, this will sent out for comments.

Brokerage for Adults – there is a draft proposal and MW is waiting for comments. The aim is to have the proposal completed by 1 April 2012. MW and BW to meet to discuss further.

Training for workers regarding Direct Payments is being planned

MW will be developing a regular bulletin and JD suggested that it could link to the RPCAG newsletter.

Short Breaks Statement is on the council's public website (see item 3 for link) this will be reviewed in February and updated, families will be involved in the process.

5. Update & Feedback from Richmond Parents Carers Action Group

MA, Chair of Me to & Co announced that Joanne Kemp (JK) has resigned as Chair for RPCAG and BW and JD have taken on the role as Joint Chair.

• Since 2008 RPCAG has gone from strength to strength and it is the appropriate time to review the Terms of Reference.

JK did a very good job with parents and participation which was appreciated; however there currently is no structure in place regarding grants.

There are grants that are outstanding:

- £8,200 Carers Grant Match funding £10,000 which has been used to help families for either specific or general issues.
- Central Government Parent Participation Grant was received in November 2011 to be used by March 2012.

A Communication Group has been set up and a Saturday Workshop which is a Self Help programme.

This event will include music/refreshments and organise an Information Event with Voluntary Organisations and provide a platform for families to network as well as a Family Fun Day
