The proposed bridge in Ham has some support but also significant opposition as it comes with considerable downsides. A new consultation that gives proper weight to the opinions of Ham and Petersham residents would give a clearer idea of support before money is spent on this project. Six storey buildings in the centre of Ham is in opposition to the area's neighbourhood plan that was

widely consulted upon. Making the centre of Ham an area for high and mid sized buildings will be at odds to the low level, semi rural character of Ham and Petersham.

The increasing protection for the margin of Grey Court school playing fields and an increased area of Ham Polo fields are welcome.

There is insufficient consideration of the impact on recreation by increasing the SINC status designation to borough wide significance of Ham Common West side of the open space. This is currently used for informal recreation by local people and has been for as long as any local person can remember. It would be good for the local community, if a consideration for the cricket club could be made for a future clubhouse should any change to the use of the Cassel was made.
