

# Duty to Cooperate Monitoring 2017-2023

London Borough of Richmond

1 May 2024

### Context

- The Localism Act requires local authorities to prepare a report, which should include (amongst other things) information on how the Council has met its Duty to Cooperate. This statement covers cooperation that has taken place on strategic planning issues under the Duty to Cooperate between 1 April 2017 and 31 March 2023.
- 2. The Duty to Cooperate was introduced under the Localism Act 2011. It places a legal duty on Local Planning Authorities (LPAs) to 'engage constructively, actively and on an on-going basis with other LPAs and public bodies in relation to strategic cross-boundary matters.
- 3. Para 24 (Previously paragraph 178 NPPF 2012) of the National Planning Policy Framework (2023) sets out the strategic priorities that public bodies have a duty to cooperate on in the preparation of the Local Plan. These are:
  - The homes and jobs needed in the area;
  - The provision of retail, leisure and other commercial development;
  - The provision of infrastructure for transport, telecommunications, waste management, water supply, wastewater, flood risk and coastal change management, and the provision of minerals and energy (including heat);
  - The provision of health, security, community and cultural infrastructure and other local facilities; and climate change mitigation and adaptation, conservation, and enhancement of the natural and historic environment, including landscape.

### Duty to Cooperate initiated by other authorities and prescribed bodies.

- 1. This Monitoring Report only covers Duty to Cooperate activity and engagement activities initiated and requested by other prescribed bodies.
- 2. The tables below set out the Duty to Cooperate activity undertaken throughout the financial years 2017/18, 2018/19, 2019/20, 2020/21, 2021/22 and 2022/23. It covers other Authorities' Planning Documents, set out by strategic issue. It can be seen that the borough is part of a number of formal joint working groups.
- 3. The borough also positively engages with the GLA in the preparation and monitoring of the spatial development strategy for London known as the London Plan, and any alterations or reviews, which cover strategic issues particularly housing, retail and employment. The borough also contributes to research projects such as the GLA's Town Centre Health Checks. The Mayor of London and the GLA are also strongly committed to working with authorities and agencies in the East and Southeast of England to co-ordinate approaches to strategic issues of common concern.
