## Help us meet your needs

We'll soon be carrying out a housing needs assessment which will help us to make sure that any new homes built on Ham Close will meet customers' needs. In order to collect this important information, a member of an independent research company (BMG Research) will be visiting you from Tuesday 11 July to Saturday 15 July. As we work towards a planning application to redevelop Ham Close, it's important that we have the most up to date information possible about you. You'll be asked to confirm details about yourself, others living in your household and your current housing needs. By confirming these type of details we'll be able to ensure that future homes are the right size for customers, and that they are adapted to meet people's needs. We also need to make sure that we have your current contact details so that we can keep you up to date with progress and news about how you can get involved.

The survey will take no more than 10 minutes to complete and we can reassure you that any information you provide will remain within RHP and won't be shared beyond BMG research.

## Technical site surveys

You might have recently seen people from a company called EDI around Ham Close. They have been there to carry out technical site surveys which include topographical assessments. This involves taking measurements to help them map the level and contours of the ground. Anyone there from EDI will have ID with them so you'll be able to identify who they are.

## Fire Safety advice

Our thoughts are with all those affected by the fire that took place at Grenfell Tower in West London last month.
Fire Safety is a key priority for us at RHP Group. All our blocks have up to date fire risk assessments which confirm we have appropriate fire precautions in place. When controls need strengthening, we do things such as fit fire rated front entrance doors and heat detectors.

The existing flats at Ham Close are not classified as 'high rise' and do not have any cladding on them. We can reassure you that fire safety precautions will be paramount as we move forward with the plans for the redevelopment.
In the event of a fire, our advice to you is to follow the guidance given by the London Fire Brigade at www. London-fire.gov.uk: If you live in a purpose built flat you should 'stay put' until you receive advice from the emergency services to do differently. If smoke, heat or flames enter your home and only if it is safe to do so, leave straight away. If you live in a converted property you are advised to evacuate immediately when you hear the fire alarm.

Today we ask all of our customers to:
, Check you have a working smoke detector
, Talk to members of your household about what to do in the event of a fire and practise using your escape route
, Book an appointment to have a fire door or heat detector fitted if we have identified you need one.
, Take a look at the fire risk assessment relevant to you through your online account
