1st floor






### **Richmond Borough of Sanctuary**

- Formal accreditation from City of Sanctuary.
- Recognises local authorities who "recognise the contribution of people seeking sanctuary. Sanctuary seekers are welcomed, included and supported within our context."
- Sanctuary Seeker is an umbrella term:
  - Refugees
  - Asylum Seekers (including Unaccompanied Children)
  - Resettlement Schemes
- Can also be schools /universities/libraries/shops/ theatres of sanctuary.


