## Notes of the meeting

### 1. Welcome

Cllr Nancy Baldwin (Cabinet Member for Equality, Communities and the Voluntary Sector) welcomed attendees to the Voluntary Sector Forum.

Tributes were paid to Cll Ellengorn and Cllr Samuels.

## 2. Driving equality with and for our communities

Jamie Fisher (Policy and Review Manager, Richmond Council) introduced Richmond Council's commitment to equality, diversity and inclusion and discussed how the Council and the VCS can work more effectively together to achieve better input, scrutiny and challenge on Council policies, strategies and service provision. As well as the cores nine protected characteristics, Richmond Council has also recently adopted Socio-economic status.

Richard Wiles (Commissioning and Procurement, Richmond Council) highlighted that equality needs analyses are two-way processes, giving the example of the Carers Hub where needs analysis resulted in an increase in the number of men taking up the service.

Julie Gavin (Interim Director, RCVS) talked about how Richmond CVS is supporting the sector in the area, including training and events (including LGBT+101 awareness session, unconscious bias, creating more diverse board), one-to-one support, and online resources.
