**Leeson and Fulwell Park Estates Parking Review – Questionnaire for Completion**

The Council is undertaking a parking review in this area – see attached map.

This review is being undertaken following requests for parking controls received by the Council from residents of this area. It is understood that some residents have faced difficulties in finding a parking space near to their home due to non-residents (including all day commuters and/or short and long stay visitors) parking in the area. A Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) can alleviate these difficulties.

We are now seeking feedback from you, the residents and businesses within the boundary on the enclosed map, on whether you would like to see a CPZ introduced. A preliminary detailed design has been produced that shows what a CPZ in this area could look like if implemented. Irrespective of whether a CPZ is introduced, most or all proposals for yellow lines will still be progressed at locations where it is considered unsafe or inappropriate to park including at junctions and/or at narrow sections of roadway. Please view the detailed design at Twickenham Library, Garfield Road, Twickenham (during opening hours) or on line (details provided later in this letter).

Should a CPZ be introduced, residents, their visitors and businesses wishing to park on street during the operational period of the CPZ will be required to purchase / display a valid parking permit. You would not be able to purchase a permit if you live in a property subject to a S106 Planning Agreement which restricts or prohibits the issue of permits.

The table below indicates the new permit costs which will be applied from 1 July 2024:

**Resident and Business permits**

The above resident permit prices are for the first permit issued per household for one year. Based on the first permit price, subsequent resident permits purchased per year are approximately 100% more for the second permit and 200% more for the third permit issued.

The prices for subsequent business permits purchased per business each year are under review. Current prices can be viewed on our website, details of which are provided at the end of this letter.

### Resident visitor permits

Resident visitor permits (scratch cards) are available at half the standard price to the over 60s. These permits must be validated for the relevant time period.

Please note that all parking charges are reviewed annually.

As part of this consultation, the Council will be reviewing the reinstatement of footway parking bays and double yellow lines carried out in 2023 in the Fulwell Park Estate area along with the feedback it receives to this consultation.

A review of the nearby South-West Twickenham CPZ (Zone CR), introduced in 2022, which operates 10am to 4.30pm on Monday to Friday is also being carried out at this time to see how this CPZ has worked since introduction and to see if any changes need to be made.

Please note that the responses to this consultation will be analysed over the whole area as well as on a street-by-street basis meaning that a CPZ could be introduced in some roads and not others if appropriate. The Council would like to demonstrate that any new scheme has the support of residents so a good response is very important, although the Council will not base its decision on residents' wishes alone. All feedback to this consultation will be considered by the Council along with all relevant traffic management and other highway factors, prior to a decision being made on the way forward.
