Funding is available to community groups, schools, faith groups, individuals or non-profits based in Richmond upon Thames. Following a quick and simple application, Microgrants are awarded every other month.

Climate Action Microgrants help fund a wide range of projects each year.

You could be re-wilding a community space, starting a repair café, developing a nature trail or hosting a public conversation about climate change.

Do Something Green

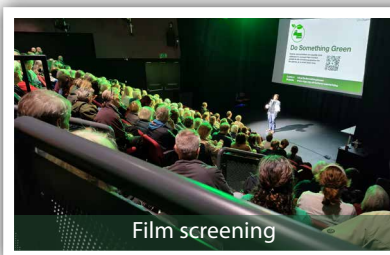
Film Screening
